Our Village is blessed with amazing Fall color. But as we know Winter follows Fall and that means cold weather and snow.

Reviewing snow removal procedure, it was noted the village dispatched our snowplows two dozen times last year to clear the streets and apply salt and sand. We used our own Highway Department supplemented by an outside contractor. This year we will follow the same snow removal procedure.

Our Police Department was awarded a grant that provided a new four wheel drive Ford Explorer. Outfitted with the latest computer and communication equipment, the car has

the capabilities to respond to emergencies during bad weather conditions.

The Village Hall has been improved also. A court grant partially financed a 25 KW generator capable of running the entire building in a power outage.

Please be reminded, PSE&G will handle downed electric wires. But if a tree is down and electric wires are not an issue the Village Highway Dept. can move the tree from the road.

In October the Board of Trustees met with the St. James Fire Commissioners and toured both St. James fire houses and reviewed their fire & safety equipment and emergency procedures.

As we go into this season of longer nights and colder temperatures I remember as a young-ster walking under a canopy of a dark sky filled with brilliant stars and planets.

Head of the Harbor's Lofty Residents



Some eagle-eyed residents may have spotted that the Village Hall cell phone tower is topped off with a large twiggy nest. This is the summer home of an osprey family from April to September, and, most importantly, it is a very good sign that we have an ecologically healthy harbor.

Ospreys are fish-eating birds of preythey swoop down on Stony Brook Harbor and catch fish in their talons. NYS has two main osprev breeding populations found on the coastlines of Long Island and the other is upstate in the Adirondack Mountains.

An adult osprey, plumed with dark brown feathers above and white feathers underneath, with a white head, and a dark crown, can measure up to 22-25 inches, and can have a wingspan of 4-6 feet. The females are somewhat larger. Ospreys live up to 20 years and a family of ospreys will use the same nest year after year.

Ospreys winter in Florida and as far away as South America. We look forward to our osprey family returning next Spring.

Highway Department Activities—Judith C. Ogden, Highway Commissioner

This has been a very active season with the drainage repair on Moriches Rd, paving of Harbor Hill and Farm Rds. and the striping of the village roads and enhanced stop lines.

A **'DO NOT BLOCK THE BOX'** was added at the intersection of Edgewood and 50 Acre Rd. to improve the exit onto Edgewood Avenue.

This fall the Highway Dept. will focus on tree trimming and cobblestone curb repair.

As a safety precaution, vegetation will be cut back along the right-of-way (ROW) if it interferes with vehicular traffic or restricts visibility. If you have ornamental shrubs along the edge of the road, please prune well off the curb, or the Highway Department may need to do so.

Cobblestone repair has begun and will continue throughout the fall. Much of the damage occurs during winter plowing.

Please help to minimize damage to the cobblestone on our roads. Flag the entrance to your drive, make sure as snow is plowed out at the end of the drive the cobble across the street is not used as a plow stop.
