**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on March 16, 2021, the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Nissequogue, Suffolk County, New York, adopted Local Law No. 1 of 2021, a local law amending Section 51-4(K) of the Code of the Village of Nissequogue to amend the fees required for renewal of a building permit. Pursuant to the local law, Section 51-4(K) of the Code of the Village of Nissequogue, will be amended to read as follows:

"K. Time limits. Building permits shall become invalid unless the authorized work is commenced within six months following the date of issuance. Building permits shall expire 12 months after the date of issuance. If a structure is not complete within 12 months after the date of issuance of a building permit, the permit may be renewed upon payment of the fee specified in or determined in accordance with the provisions set forth in § 51-16 and application to the Code Enforcement Officer. Any further renewals shall be by application to the Board of Trustees which, upon reasonable cause being shown, may extend said permit for a finite period at the fee specified in or determined in accordance with the provisions set forth in § 51-16."
